Leh: Congratulating and praying for His Holiness Dalai Lama's good health and long life on his 85th birthday, Ladakh Buddhist Association, All Ladakh Gonpa Association, and Sonamling Tibetan Settlement jointly organised a symbolic celebration on July 6 at Jivetsal.

He is believed to be manifestations of Avalokiteshvara or Chenrezig, the Bodhisattva of Compassion. In 1959, following the brutal suppression of the Tibetan national uprising in Lhasa by Chinese troops, His Holiness was forced to escape into exile. Since then he has been living in Dharamsala. In 1989, he was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for his non-violent struggle for the liberation of Tibet.

Councilors of Hill Council, Leh raised the issue faced because of the lack of coordination between the Hill Council and UT administration. After the grant of UT status, a gap in the relation between Hill Council and UT administration lead to the protest of Hill Council members in front of Raj Niwas on May 4 over the lack of, comprehensive roadmap by the UT administration for the evacuation of stranded people outside Ladakh and evacuation of patient and old age people by air. Earlier, an audio clip of BJP local leaders accusing UT administration headed by Lt. Governor R K Mathur for taking decisions without taking Hill Council into confidence also got viral. Members of Hill Council, Leh demanded empowerment and strengthening of Hill Council which has achieved the autonomous status after lots of struggle and sacrifice.

As per the sources, discussion was also held to convince Chering Dorjay Lakruk, Former BJP Ladakh, President back in the party who resigned from his political position and party membership in May. The resignation letter of Chering Dorjay accused UT administration of rendering the autonomous Hill Council of both Leh and Kargil ineffective. Also, the allegation was made on UT administration insensitivity and callous attitude to evacuate stranded passengers, pilgrims, and students of Ladakh in different other states amidst COVID-19 pandemic.

Chairmen of the Block Development Council requested Ram Madhav to get their office established soon to carry out their work efficiently and effectively. Also, they asked for the funds of BDC to be sanctioned.

L-G Mathur launches Mental Health OPD, Telephonic Medical consultation

LEH: Mental Health OPD and Telephonic Medical Consultation in both the district hospitals of Leh and Kargil were launched digitally by R K Mathur, Lieutenant Governor on July 13 at Raj Niwas.

Dr. Padma Angmo, Psychiatrist informed about the growing number of mental health issues in Ladakh including depression, drug addiction, and suicides.

R K Mathur expressed his hope that the mental health facilities in hospitals will provide help and support to the people who have mental health issues. He stressed on the need to strengthen the psychiatry role in district hospitals and to have de-addiction centres in Leh and Kargil.

Also, he enquired about the availability of COVID-19 testing capacity in Ladakh keeping

in view the need for tourism.

Dr. Phuntsog Angchuk, Director Health informed about the services to be provided in the mental health OPD that include general psychiatry, psychotherapy, behavioural therapy, child guidance clinic, and de-addiction. The OPD days are Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

He said that the telephonic medical consultation OPD will be available at SNM Hospital, Leh from Tuesday to Saturday, and at District Hospital, Kargil from Monday to Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. People can avail the telephonic consultation OPD services in Leh on 01982-256907 and 01985-233255 for Kargil district hospital.

Dr. Angchuk informed R K Mathur about the procurement of one additional COVID-19 testing machine (RT – PCR) and an automatic RNA Extractor for Ladakh with the help of ICMR.

11 arrested in connection with bitumen scam in Leh

LEH: Two junior engineers of GREF, a crusher plant owner, and 8 truck drivers were arrested in connection with the bitumen scam in Leh on the intervening night of July 6 and 7. 480 barrels of bitumen worth ₹36,30,663

was seized.

A case FIR No.179/2020 under section 409,411,109,120-B of IPC was registered at Police Station Leh.

The incident came into light on the intervening night of July 6

and 7 when the patrolling party of Police Station, Leh headed by ASI, Rigzin Paljor noticed some suspicious movement of 8 trucks to a crusher plant. When police raided the location, it was found that all the trucks loaded with Bitumen were being unloaded at the crusher plant. Each truck was carrying 60 barrels, making a total of 480 bitumen barrels. On further inquiry of the tax invoice vouchers produced by the drivers, it was found that the 60 barrels of bitumen belonged to GREF and were meant to be unloaded somewhere else.

All the accused are under police remand and the case is in the investigation process.

Stories from Ladakh

Dance means everything to me. I feel like I am the best version of myself when I am dancing. I feel like I am in a different world. I have always liked being on stage. The first time was at a small event in my mother's village. My sister and I even wore matching dresses while performing. Back then I had no idea that I would open the first dance academy of Ladakh.

I started taking professional dance classes in Delhi in 11th standard. After a month, the teacher encouraged me to try more dance forms. I started to learn which forms belong to me and what kind of emotions I build when I move this way or dance that way. I learnt that ballet has the deepest techniques and auditioned for the Imperial Fernando Ballet Company, the best ballet school in India. I was one among the 17 selected people and got full scholarship.

By this time, I was already pursuing mechanical and automotive engineering. I used to get up at 4 or 5 in the morning to study, go to college for attendance and by noon, head to the dance studio. I would return at night and study some more. In my final year, I dropped dancing and enrolled in engineering coaching. I studied the whole year and was placed at General Motors. That year taught me that I am not an engineer. I did not take the job and continued dancing with the ballet company.

My parents didn't know anything about me pursuing dance. They thought I was preparing for further studies. In Ladakh, if you are going to be someone, you have to be an engineer or a doctor. That's what we were fed since childhood. If we weren't, maybe we would realize our passion sooner. About a year after my graduation I knew I had to say something, so I told my mom. She thought that I was only dancing till I was in Delhi and accepted what I wanted to do.

Around that time, I had injured my ribcage and was in a big dilemma. I thought that if my body doesn't support me, how I will be able to dance throughout my life. In June 2017, I returned to Ladakh and told my parents that I wanted to open a dance academy. I felt that without it, there would be no generation gap between me and those that follow. They would also have to go outside Ladakh to learn that we can do something different. I wanted to give them a platform.

I asked my parents to give me a year and if it didn't work, I could lean back on my degree. Once they realized that I had a plan, my father started looking for a space to rent for the dance studio. When I started the admissions at the end of 2017, I had seven students. Two of them were my cousins. I never used to count how many students came. I was full of positivity and energy. I would mop, sweep, teach and clean. I was everything. This winter, I had 700 students.

I feel I have learnt everything from dancing, especially discipline. It's the most important thing I needed. I got it from dance and it got me here.

LEH: Lieutenant Governor, Radha Krishna Mathur discussed roles and functioning of both the Hill Councils, Leh and Kargil with the CEC's Gyal P. Wangyal and Feroz Ahmed Khan on July 4.

Lieutenant Governor emphasized on enhancing the abilities of both the Hill Council to fully utilize their budget and deliver greater benefits to the people of Ladakh.

He also launched the Mission Organic Development Initiative (M.O.D.I) of Ladakh and Ladakh Greenhouse Project aiming to steer Ladakh on a sustainable path.

Initiated by Hill Council, Leh in 2019, Mission Organic Development Initiative is a Special Development Project budgeted at ₹ 500 crore to introduce organ-

ic farming into the mainstream agricultural production system. The project is proposed to be implemented in three phases in different blocks of Leh and Kar-

In the first phase, 66 villages of Leh and Kargil districts will be converted into organic villages by the end of the financial year 2020, while 85 villages will achieve certification by 2023. The final phase of M.O.D.I will include the conversion of 90 villages as organic by 2025.

R K Mathur said, "By converting Ladakh into an organic state, we will be able to achieve Prime Minister Modi's vision of a Carbon Neutral Ladakh." He said that establishing a proper supply chain and infrastructure to process and market the product is of utmost importance.

Other than transforming agriculture in Ladakh into a sustainable occupation, M.O.D.I will enable farmers to realize 30% to 40 % of additional income by leveraging the demand of the organic market.

Ladakh Greenhouse Project was also launched to improve vegetable availability in Ladakh through deep winter greenhouse farming. A result of six years of research and development, the greenhouse using polycarbonate as the covering material, has been developed by the Defence Institute of High Altitude Research (DIHAR). In comparison to traditional greenhouses, the polycarbonate greenhouse is found to be warmer, requires lower maintenance, can withstand snow load, and has a shelf life of 20 - 25 years. Most importantly, these greenhouses can be cultivated round the year.

Lauding the initiative, R K Mathur stated that all households must be able to benefit from these greenhouses and suggested construction in village clusters to support the value chain and derive commercial advantage.

The project has been allotted a budget of₹ 76.44 crore and is targeting the installation of 1676 greenhouses over two years in Leh and Kargil districts. Hill Council, Leh, and Kargil will select beneficiaries for implementation for both the projects.

Hill Council, Leh welcomes Secretary, Ravinder Kumar; discuss major projects

LEH: Hill Council, Leh lead by Gyal P Wangyal, CEC welcomed Secretary, Ravinder Kumar, and discussed departments under his portfolio on July 13.

Expressing great hope on Ravinder Kumar, Gyal P Wangyal said that his administrative experience including his service as SDM Nubra in the year 2014-15 would immensely benefit Ladakh.

He briefed Secretary Kumar about the functioning and role of Hill Council, Leh in the overall development of Leh district. Also, he highlighted the need of solving stray dog menace in Leh district on priority, early completion of Ice Hockey Rink at Leh, promotion of sports like Archery, Marathon, Athletics, Ice-Hockey, and Boxing.

Phuntsog Stanzin, EC Agriculture stressed early completion of Cold Storage and Milk Pasteurization plants at Leh to benefit farmers in the coming months and provision for allotment of Cow units under the Mission Organic Development Initiative scheme.

Gyal P Wangyal highlighted the scope and potential of Solar,

Hydel, and geothermal energy in Leh district. He directed Secretary Kumar to focus on mega solar energy projects starting with 50 MW Solar Power Plants at Leh and laying of transmission lines in Dha-Hanu valley to make the best use of 18 MW Hydel power generation from Dha and Hanu Hydel projects which are at the last stage of its commissioning.

Ravinder Kumar assured to give his best in achieving the maximum and quality results, focusing on major pending and new projects.

He said that to solve stray dog menace which is becoming a major problem and threat for humans as well as domestic and wildlife animals in Leh will be taken seriously by involving the community in a campaign mode in the coming days.

He said that Ladakh not only has huge potential to become self-reliant in power generation but can emerge as a supplier of clean energy to other states in the future. He further added that harnessing solar, hydel, and geothermal energy in Ladakh would be a prime focus

Regarding technical education and skill development in Leh, Secretary Kumar said that he is trying to expand the campus of the Entrepreneurship Development Institute (EDI Leh) to conduct skill training to unemployed youths of Ladakh at large scale.

Hill Council, Kargil, delegation calls on L-G Mathur

Discuss functioning of Hill Councils, relation with UT Administration

KARGIL: Delegation of Hill Council, Kargil lead by Feroz Ahmed Khan, CEC met functionaries of UT administration and Hill Council, Leh during a three-day visit to Leh from July 4 to 7.

The delegation discussed various key issues with Hill Council, Leh, including roles and responsibilities of the Hill Council in the present setup. Need to clearly define the jurisdiction of all the public institutions in the context of the LAHDC Act was stressed upon.

Need of framing Domicile Law and putting on hold any recruitment till such a law is enacted, incorporation of the LAHDC Act 1997 in the setup of PFMS so as to enable the LAHDCs to realize their true purpose, delegation of financial powers to subordinates of the LG and issues arising out of it, enhancement of exercising of financial powers by the LAH-DCs, relaxation in the tendering process given the short working season, formulation of business rules, transfers and postings of employees, complete revocation of SRO 202, regularization of Rehbar-e-Khel Teachers, recruitments of the local youth in J&K Bank, special reservation in professional colleges of the UT J&K and the rest of the country,

intervention needed for resolution of issues related to Ladakh supplies, mass promotion of students from Class I to Class IX, release of funds to meet reimbursement cost of transportation charges of students, patients and residents evacuated from the rest of the country and other issues were discussed.

A joint delegation of Hill Council, Leh and Kargil called upon Lieutenant Governor, R. K Mathur. Advisor to LG Umang Narula:

Commissioner/Secretary, Rigzin Samphel; Divisional Commissioner, Saugat Biswas besides other senior officers were also present.

R K Mathur assured Hill Council's that the demand highlighted shall be given due consideration.

Feroz Ahmed Khan also submitted a separate memorandum to the LG Ladakh enlisting some specific issues pertaining to Kargil district. He urged the LG to implement the SRO 120 in letter and spirit thereby effecting the rotation of the office of the Divisional Commissioner in Kargil at the earliest. He further requested to expedite the setup of the Administrative Headquarters of UT Ladakh at Kargil.

Also, the establishment of COVID-19 lab in Kargil, trans-

fer of employees of Kargil presently working outside the district as well as outside the UT Ladakh, the stationing of Directors at their respective headquarters, payment of work done liabilities of works executed on the 200 Bedded Hospital at Kurbathang and various works executed under Languishing Projects, completion of feasibility study of the Kargil Airport for the landing of Boeing sized aircraft and evacuation of the Kurbathang Plateau were also highlighted.

R K Mathur directed the Advisor to address the issues raised by the CEC on a priority basis.

Advisor, Umang Narula informed that some doctors of District Hospital Kargil have been nominated for training at a special COVID Training Facility at Chandigarh and establishment of a separate COVID-19 lab at Kargil is also in the pipeline.

Regarding the implementation of SRO 120, he informed that Additional Commissioner as envisaged in the SRO 120 has been sought from UT J&K for the purpose of operation of the office of the Divisional Commissioner at Kargil. Also, UT Administration Ladakh is in the process of setting up offices of the UT Administration in Kargil and the same shall be expedited

He advised the department to explore and promote cheese and butter production

The Agriculture and Cooperative Department was asked to encourage organic manure among the farmers and make it available to the farmers, to achieve the objectives of the Mission Organic Development Initiative (MODI) of Ladakh. The department was asked to conduct special drives to ensure 100% coverage of eligible beneficiaries under the beneficiary oriented schemes.

Tashi Namgyal, Councillor, Tangtse; Sarpanch Tangtse, and Sarpanch Durbuk met the Advisor and apprised him of various issues pertaining to the area. Sarpanch Man-Pangong and Lambardar Phobrang discussed their grievances with the Advisor.

Umang Narula assured that all necessary steps will be taken to redress their grievances.

COVID-19: Lesson learned and way forward

World Health Organization (WHO) identified a new type of 2019 novel coronavirus (mutant strain) in early January 2020 and

was named COVID-19 officially on February 10. As the virus spreads rapidly around the world, WHO declared the novel coronavirus outbreak Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC). On March 11, COVID-19 was declared a global pandemic. The mortality rate caused by COVID-19 is on the rise with no vaccine available to date.

The novel coronavirus is categorized under an emerging and re-emerging infectious disease. Emerging and Re-emerging Infectious diseases are newly identified, previously unknown infections or those spreading to new geographical areas causing public health problems either nationally or internationally. History has witnessed many emerging and re-emerging diseases like Spanish flu in 1918, H1N1 flu in 2009, SARS in 2003, and MERS CoV in 2012.

India reported the first case of coronavirus on January 30, 2020. Ministry of Health and Family Welfare issued a travel advisory for international travellers entering the country to self-quarantine for 14 days. Travel visas were cancelled until April 15, 2020, and state administrations were asked to invoke the Epidemic Disease Act. On 24 March 2020, Prime Minister ordered a nationwide lockdown for 21 days which got extended up to June with conditional re-

laxation. The lockdown period brought fruitful results in India as compared to the global figures in recovery rate, flattening of the epidemic curve, time for preparedness of setting up makeshift dedicated COVID-19 hospital, and procurement of logistics. Keeping in view the decreased prevalence of COVID-19 in proportion to the total population of India and long term detrimental impact on the Indian economy, Government announced lockdown relaxations in phased manner except for containment zones. On June 8, India stepped out after 74 days.

To prevent the community spread and to contain the virus, states issued their guidelines in line with the national guidelines. To mount the response for containing the spread of the virus in India, ₹15,000 crore has been approved by the cabinet on 22 April 2020. The main objective of COVID- 19 Emergency Response and health system preparedness package is to slow down and limit the spread of coronavirus infection in India. It aims in developing diagnostics and COVID-19 dedicated treatment facilities, centralized procurement of essential medical equipment and drugs, setting up laboratories and bolster surveillance activities, pandemic research, engage communities, and conduct risk communication activities. The project will be implemented in three phases from January 2020 to March 2024. Phase - 1 from January 2020 to June 2020, phase - 2 from July 2020 to March 2021, Phase - 3 from April 2021 to March 2024. Facilities such as COVID care centre, dedicated COVID health centre, COVID hospital with ICU facility have been set up. On July 5, the



Social distancing, hand hygiene, respiratory etiquette, wearing masks, and lockdown measures to prevent community transmission is not a new concept.

world's largest COVID care facility with 10,000 beds was inaugurated.

Keeping all the facts of COVID-19, the world has learned that there are two ways to control the spread that is either by vaccination and herd immunity. Herd immunity is the indirect protection of a small portion of the population when most of the population is immune to an infectious disease. For COVID-19, we need 80% of the population to be immune to have herd protection with RO or naught value between 5 to 6 which determines the contagiousness of the infectious disease.

Vaccine development may take 12-18 months to launch as it involves a series of population-based clinical trials for efficacy to see if the vaccine works in ideal conditions and to test the effectiveness in real-world conditions and post-market-

ing surveillance. Besides this, planning for the identification of priority groups and information about epidemiology (study about population) is needed. As of date, at least 7 Indian companies are developing COVID- 19 vaccines. As per the World Health Organization, 13 human trials are underway and more than 120 others are in the initial stage of development.

To conclude there is a need to address issues other than mortality, like wide-spread loss of access to health care, long term health complications that can follow COVID-19 infection, disruption to economic and social activity, psychosocial component, and social discrimination. Stringent and effective measures by testing, contact tracing, and isolation can reduce community transmission to a large extent. Also, it is necessary to un-

derstand the disease mechanism, attributable factors, health problems, emergence, and re-emergence to respond in a proportionate and timely manner. This will help in detecting, preventing, and combating future pandemics.

COVID-19 pandemic has taught the world that we need to invest our resources to cope with these emerging and re-emerging diseases by building up a robust public health infrastructure. No matter how much the world progresses, it has taught the lesson that 'Prevention is better than cure'.

District Magistrate, Leh further relaxes COVID-19 lockdown

Allows restaurants/dhabas to open with 50% seating and Public Transport resumption with 25% seating capacity

Leh: Sachin Kumar Vaishya, Chairman, District Disaster Management Authority issued an order regarding Unlock 2.0 – opening of restaurants/ dhabas & resumption of public transport on July 13 and came into force from July 14.

The order reads as, "In continuation to this office order No. DCL/PS/COVID-19/OO/2020 Dated 12.06.2020 followed by order No. 701 Dated 02.07.2020, & order No. 708 Dated 07.07.2020, and in exercise of power conferred upon me under Section-34 of Disaster Management Act, 2005 and Section-144 of CrPC, 1973, I, Sachin Kumar Vaishya, IAS, Chairman, DDMA/District Magistrate, Leh hereby order that:

All Restaurants/Dhabas and other hospitality services within district Leh shall be permitted to operate with 50% seating capacity as per the SOP. Also, public transport (Buses/Mazda Buses) shall be allowed to ply with 25% seating capacity as per the SOP.

However, the SOPs/Guidelines laid down by the MHA/MoHFW & UT Administration of Ladakh from time to time in order to contain the spread of COVID-19 shall be followed in letter & spirit.

SOP for opening of Restaurants/Dhabas and other protocol services are:

- 1. Seating arrangement in the restaurant to be made in such a way that adequate social distancing is maintained.
- 2. Disposable menus are advised to be used.
- 3. Instead of cloth napkins, use of good quality disposable paper napkins to be encouraged.
- 4. Contactless mode of ordering and digital mode of payment (using e-wallets) to be encouraged.
- 5. Buffet service should also follow social distancing norms among guests.
- 6. Entrance to have mandatory hand hygiene (sanitizer dispenser) and thermal screening provisions.
- 7. Only asymptomatic staff and patrons shall be allowed.
- 8. All staff and patrons to be allowed entry only if using face cover/masks. The face cover/masks have to be worn at all times inside the restaurant.
- 9. Posters/standees/AV media on preventive measures about COVID-19 to be displayed prominently.
- 10. Adequate manpower shall be deployed by restaurant management for ensuring social

distancing norms.

- 11. Specific markings may be made with sufficient distance to manage the queue and ensure social distancing in the premises.
- 12. Maintaining physical distancing of a minimum of 6 feet, when queuing up for entry and inside the restaurant as far as feasible.

SOP for Public Transport (Buses & Mazda Buses)

Plying of Public transport shall be permitted with the following conditions:

- 1. Buses shall ply with only 25% of the seating capacity.
- Social distancing among passengers shall be ensured.
 Municipal Committee, Leh shall mark cir-
- cles at the Bus stops.4. All the bus owners shall ensure availability

of hand sanitizer in the buses.

- 5. Effective and frequent Sanitization of the buses including the handles, knob, buttons and frequently touched surfaces shall be en-
- 6. Passenger shall be made to sit in the buses as per social distancing norms.

Several other issues regarding the function of KREDA like the supply of power from Sangrah and Chillung SHPs to the Power Grid, signing of Power Purchase Agreement with PDD J&K for revenue generation by charging of power tariff for around 10 MW power generated from the hydro projects of KREDA, maintenance of projects, salaries of engineering and office staff associated with the project besides other issues came up for thorough discussion during the meeting.
