LEH: The 11th edition of the Sustainable Mountain Development Summit (SMDS) began on October 11 at Sindhu Sanskriti Kendra, Leh.

Union Cabinet Minister for Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF-CC) and Labour & Employment, Bhupender Yadav, presided over the opening session of SMDS. Chairman/CEC, Advocate Tashi Gyalson; MP Ladakh, Jamyang Tsering Namgyal; GOC 14 Corps Lt. Gen Anindya Sengupta; Principal Secretary Forest, Dr. Pawan Kotwal, PCCF Ladakh, Jigmet Takpa and President IMI, PD Rai were also present.

Youths from different states, UTs, and districts of the Indian Himalayan Region (IHR) presented a declaration with collective recommendations from the 5th Indian Himalayan Youth Summit held on October 9 on the theme 'Sustainability and Entrepreneurship for the youths of IHR'.

LEH: LAHDC Leh hosted the Mountain Legislators' Meet themed, 'Extended Producer Responsibility: Policy to Practice' on the occasion of Sustainable Mountain Development Summit XI in the Assembly Hall of the Council Secretariat on October 11.

Issues of climate change and solid waste management, including the need for extending EPRs in the mountain states and UTs of the nation, were discussed during the meeting. Virtually attending the meeting, delegates from the United Nations Environment Programme and the European Union also presented their visions and projects to tackle waste management. Report compiled on Brand Audit in Leh by the govt. school students and volunteers of NYK Leh were presented by Secy IMI and founder Little Green World during the meet.

CEC Tashi Gyalson presented the declaration of the MLM and moved a resolution on the need for extending EPRs in the Indian Himalayan Mountain States and UTs.

The resolution was unanimously passed and signed by all the elected representatives present during the meeting.

Indian Himalayan Youth Summit-V inaugurated in Leh

L-G advises youth to focus on sustainable practices

LEH: Indian Himalayan Youth Summit-V organised by Integrated Mountain Initiative (IMI) and Sustainable Development Forum of Ladakh with support from the UT Administration and LAHDC Leh as a part of the Sustainable Mountain Development Summit (SMDS) XI inaugurated on October 9 at Sindhu Sanskriti Kendra (SSK).

Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh, RK Mathur attended the inaugural session.

Terming the Himalayan region, most important ecologically as they determine the climate of the country and the world, LG Mathur stressed the need for youth taking part in the Summit to deliberate and record the outcomes of the event so that it could be heard and implemented at both regional and national levels.

He emphasised the need to focus on quality tourism and spreading the benefit of tourist activities in all parts of a region rather than allowing it to concentrate in a few places. He stated that tourism enables the consolidation of the cultural aspect of a region and emphasised the need for Himalayan states to respect, own, and propagate their culture for the overall benefit of society. He emphasised the need to balance the environment, economy, and socio-cultural aspects to achieve sustainable tourism.

LG Mathur suggested that youth may focus on primary sector activities such as growing medicinal and aromatic plants, buckwheat, etc. as there are

tremendous livelihood opportunities without causing any damage to the environment. He informed about various initiatives taken by the Administration along with the Hill Councils to provide employment to the youth and encourage and support aspiring entrepreneurs from Ladakh.

LG Mathur stated that youth from Ladakh have better opportunities than youth in other parts of the country. He informed that the rationalization of wildlife boundaries has been initiated to benefit the people of Ladakh and make them prosperous.

Later, LG Mathur launched e-vehicles and handed over keys to officials from three government offices.

Chairman, LAHDC Leh, Advocate Tashi Gyalson informed that the Summit is a platform for youth from Ladakh to interact with youth from other Himalayan states and UTs to discuss common issues and learn from each other. He stated that youth can make a lot of difference in coming up with possible solutions and drafting policies for the benefit of the people of the Himalayan regions.

State Transport Authority decides on contract carriage permit system in Ladakh

LEH: In light of ongoing dispute between the transport unions of Kargil and Leh district, Saugat Biswas, Chairperson, State Transport Authority, Ladakh clarified that under the Motor Vehicle Act, Transport Authority decides the routes or areas for which Contract Carriage Permits are issued to an applicant.

On October 3 a press conference was held in which , Saugat Biswas informed that due care has been taken to maximise the benefits for every such applicant for a Contract Carriage Permit be it from Leh or Kargil district. The vehicles will be issued permits for plying in the territory of the district in which they are registered as well as the National Highways of Ladakh. In addition they will also ply to the tourist spots in the vicinity of NH-1D.

For plying in the inner routes of Ladakh, all contract carriage permit holders will be eligible for Temporary Permit which may be issued by the concerned ARTOs on the basis of a demand for vehicles. Biswas further informed that the MoU for reciprocal movement of vehicles between J&K and Ladakh will continue.

It was also informed that the Transport Department will regularly review the implementation of the permit system and if required modifications will be made to further improve upon the system after a defined period.

Earlier, Regional Transport Officer UT Ladakh, Regional Transport Authorities of Ladakh, and Commissioner/Secretary Transport Ladakh held a series of meetings with the Taxi/ Tempo Unions and other transport associations of both the districts; however, the associations could not reach any mutually agreeable solution on the issue.

The State Transport Authority of Ladakh on October 3 decided on the areas/route(s) to be allowed for the Contract Carriage Permits for vehicles registered in both the districts of Ladakh.

The Elderline aims to connect and engage with senior citizens and serve them in a compassionate manner through the National Helpline No 14567 and provide assistance, information and support to help them live with dignity.

Commissioner/Secretary, Social & Tribal Welfare Dept, Ladakh, Padma Angmo (Chief Guest) congratulated Helpage India and NISD on the launch of Elderline and stated that for making Ladakh a model old age-friendly UT, community participation is critical. She urged for regular coordination and collaboration between the community, NGOs, Volunteers, and Social Welfare Deptt and other Departments like Health and Medical Education Department, Higher Education Department, and Rural Development Department. Commissioner/Secretary sought the involvement of all stakeholders in formulating the UT policy for Old Age people and stressed the need for a robust survey through the University of Ladakh for getting reliable data related to senior citizens and the issues that they face while formulating the policy. She said that training programmes for geriatric care have been made in the last year and more such training shall be held for the same in future.

Earlier in a detailed presentation, Dr. Rajesh Kumar, State Head (H.P & Ladakh) Helpage India briefed about Elderline and its objectives and how the Helpline is functioning in various states and UT across the country. Talking about the vision of making Ladakh an age-friendly UT, Dr Rajesh Kumar stated that a positive difference in the lives of senior citizens can be made by creating a reliable national helpline that acts as a platform for redressing the grievances of the senior citizens of India, by providing necessary information and intervention through a collective of highly committed partners including Govt Agencies, Non-Profit Organizations, private sector and volunteers. Mental health issues springing from isolation, neglect, poverty and loneliness are issues that are observed among the elderly as per the national data. He spoke about the four important components that are required to make any state or UT age-friendly viz. income security, food security, health security and access to elderly care and security of shelter in the form of State-run old age homes/ Day Care Centres and said that Helpage India would like to work with the UT Administration to make Ladakh among the most elder friendly UT in the country.

LEH: The 2nd State Broadband Committee (SBC) of the Union territory of Ladakh was held under the chairmanship of Advisor Ladakh, Umang Narula at the Civil Secretariat, Leh on October 11.

Advisor Narula observed that there has been a lot of improvement in terms of additional towers that have come up in Ladakh after it became a Union Territory. He said that the identification of land and required paperwork for setting up additional towers should take place during the winter season so that work can start immediately in the next working season. He stated that digital communication in Ladakh should be upgraded most urgently and asked the telecom operators to start rolling out 5G services in Ladakh by 2023.

priority in unreached areas. He asked them to appoint dedicated officers on the ground to address the grievances of the people.

Principal Secretary of the IT Department, Sanjiv Khirwar, stated that to ensure complete coverage of villages, 128 Project sites (Mobile Towers) covering 192 villages have been sanctioned by DoT. Additional 133 villages/hamlets have been sanctioned by DoT under the 4G Saturation project, he added. The Principal Secretary asked the telecom operators to come up with a winter action plan to address the issues faced during the winter months.

CGM, BSNL, J&K Circle, Sanjiv Tyagi apprised the meeting that BSNL has been onboarded on PGCIL fiber to ensure redundancy in the BSNL network for the Ladakh region.

Sr. DDG, J&K LSA, Sunita Chandra urged the telecom operators to ensure the maintenance of the existing infrastructure so that good quality of service and availability of the network is ensured to the public.

Dhananjay Gawanday of COAI said that private operators need to step up their involvement in the region. There is a requirement to cater not only to the local population but also to the security forces, tourists, and migrant population in the region, he added. He further said that in areas where power supply is a constraint, Ladakh has got a good potential for solar power and as it develops further, operators would also look forward to having access to green energy.

I will share the reasons for my ill-health and how you all (especially the higher authorities) can help me and pull me out of this troublesome time but let me first recall the

strong association we shared from last so many centuries and decades.

I am always grateful for the kind of respect and care I got from the people of Ladakh. Irrespective of communal lines, we always shared a very close and strong relationship. Whether it was a celebration or mourning, I always formed a part of it. When most of my companions (other trees of Ladakh) shed their leaves in winter months to take a break, I decided to stay green for I know the people of Ladakh will need me the most during winters as you 'ALL' will be celebrating the most auspicious occasion of LOSAR. I recall the innumerable times when I got myself burned just to produce the smoke with that particular fragrance. I always pushed myself to work more in order to add more branches so that everyone gets their share of SHUKPA in their homes. Sometimes living alone on the ridges of high mountains, I ask myself if it was all worth doing and am I being forgotten. The thought strikes because currently I am really in a bad situation and almost on the verge of getting extinct. Sadly, noone seems to care.

Till now I have tried my best to serve you all but sadly I am sick and it is becoming hard for me to keep up. If the situation continues to stay the same I am afraid, I will not be able to survive for long in Ladakh. The changing climatic conditions (global warming), modernization (the current generation do not protect and care the same like the older ones) and developmental works are taking a toll on my health. Sometimes I do not get enough water needed for my daily activities and sometimes due to the shortage people overharvest me which makes it hard to regenerate. To be frank, I am not able to maintain my population which declined exponentially in the last 1-2 decades. Fortunately, I have found a solution for the current problem but for that I will need the support of you all. In my opinion, if I am declared the state tree of Ladakh, I will be much more protected and conserved. Firstly, more people will get to know about me which will strengthen the conservation efforts. Secondly, a state will never want its state tree to get extinct and therefore, the authorities will surely undertake various plantation programmes in order to increase my population. I wanted

to share this with you all a very long time ago but I was waiting for a perfect moment and I have heard that we have now become a Union Territory. Earlier we formed a part of Jammu and Kashmir, and they already had a state tree (Chinar Tree) and there was no way that I could have been declared the state tree. So, I felt this is the time to talk to you all and through this letter I want to appeal to the people of Ladakh to help me in getting the status of state tree. Like you all,

Ladakh is very precious to me as well and I do not want to get extinct. Please act, your Juniper tree needs help. Let your voice reach the concerned authorities by posting #ISupportJuniperAsStateTree on your social media accounts.



In Conversation with

Ashraf Ali Sheikh, Member, Maulana Azad Education Foundation, Ministry of Minority Affairs, Govt. of India

Q. Brief us about Maulana Azad Education Foundation, Ministry of Minority Affairs, Govt. of India. What are its role and importance?

The Ministry of Minority Affairs ensures a more focused approach towards issues relating to the notified minority communities namely Muslim, Christian, Buddhist, Sikhs, Parsis, and Jain. Under the Ministry of Minority Affairs, there are many departments such as the Haj committee, Central Waqf Council, etc, and likewise, Maulana Azad Education Foundation (MAEF) is also one of them. The Foundation is a voluntary, non-political, non-profit making social service organization, established to promote education amongst educationally backward sections of Society. It is fully funded by the Ministry of Minority Affairs, Govt. of India.


Maulana Azad Education Foundation (MAEF) strives to provide quality education and also provide scholarships for students who can't continue their education without financial support. The foundation also tries to encourage and enhance the skills of local artists.

There are various schemes for education, grant-in-aid, skill development programme, and many others which can be availed by the beneficiaries.

Q. Sir, you mentioned providing employment opportunities and encouraging local artists, but if we talk about Ladakh the reality seems a bit different. After UT status in Ladakh, there have been many beautification projects, carried out by the non-locals despite having very skilled and talented local artists. What do you have to say about it?

Talking about the beautification projects carried out by the non-locals, I am not aware of it, but if that is the situation, then the UT administration and the stakeholders should sit together and discuss the issues. Maulana Azad Education Foundation has been conducting an exhibition for the past few years namely "Hunar Hut" under which we have taken works, crafts, cuisines, etc, from different states for exhibition. From Ladakh, we have exhibited the Pashmina, wood carvings and cooper works at the national level in the past years. So through these platforms, we have been trying to encourage people.

Q. What are the various schemes provided by the Govt. for the minorities and how many of them have been implemented in Ladakh so far?



Message to the readers

Media has been playing an important role in bringing up the problems faced by the people and would like to congratulate each journalist that the power and influence of media have increased and so are the voice of people.

We all are aware of various scholarship schemes like pre-matric, post-matric, financial aid, and many more, which are provided by the Ministry of Minority Affairs. After becoming the Governing Body Member of Maulana Azad Education Foundation, I have tried to implement schemes in Ladakh for hostel facilities, coaching centers, etc. We are in continuous touch with the Central Waqf Council (CWC) and Ministry for the enhancement of education and institutional structures in both Leh and Kargil. We have also discussed setting up a UPSC coaching centre in Ladakh for which last year members from CWC came to Ladakh and reviewed it. The work for the UPSC coaching centre has already started in Kargil and will soon begin in Leh also.

Q. Tell us about your work and what are your plans and priorities?

Different state has different problems and we try to find a solution to these problems. In Ladakh, the awareness about the schemes for minorities is very low, people only know about the scholarship schemes and apart from that, they don't have much information. There is a scheme Pradhan Mantri Jan Vikas Karyakaram (PM-JVK), which offers funds for education, health, and many more. In regions like Changthang and Nubra, many schemes have been intro-

duced and have been approved from both ends also. The seats for the scholarship have been increased and the system has been improved to make it hassle-free because earlier there were many inconveniences students were facing.

Q. Ladakh after UT status there have been continuous demands for safeguard, so according to you how important is the safeguard for the people of Ladakh?

The safeguard for the people is very important but there has to be a clear idea of which safeguard are the people demanding. There is a different kind of safeguards there as statehood, council empowerment, etc., so having a clear idea and information regarding them is very important.

Q. How aware people are about the role of MAEF and various Govt. schemes? What are the initiatives taken by the govt to create awareness?

Review meeting of Hanle Dark Sky Reserve, other projects held

LEH: Principal Secretary, Forest, Ecology & Environment, Dr. Pawan Kotwal reviewed the status of various projects viz. Hanle Dark Sky Reserve, Revised Home Stay Scheme, Ladakh Pollution Control Committee, and other important developmental projects on October 3 at Civil Secretariat, Leh.

Mufti Sajjad Hussain, Chief Wildlife Warden/ Member Secretary, Ladakh Pollution Control Committee apprised the meeting that 18 community telescopes for the Hanle Dark Sky Reserve have been procured through the Indian Institute of Astrophysics (IIA) and an equal number of beneficiaries have been selected by the selection committee for the distribution of telescopes.

He said that the selected beneficiaries will undergo training from the experts of IIA, Bangalore regarding the operation and handling of the telescopes from October 3 to 7, 2022, at Hanley village. The training will be followed by the distribution of telescopes and light management material which will help in livelihood generation for the locals, he added. Tourists can use these telescopes for basic night sky gazing, and identification of constellations among others. He said that the project Himank authorities have been requested for the construction of the entry gate and other infrastructure of the reserve.

Principal Secretary, Dr. Kotwal said that Hanle Dark Sky Reserve located in Hanle of the Changthang Wildlife Sanctuary, the highest astronomical observatory in the world is going to be a unique facility in India. He shared that it is one of a kind and the entire process of putting up this facility together should be very well documented.

Regarding homestays in protected areas, sanctuaries, and national parks in Changthang, Nubra, and Hemis, the Chief Wildlife Warden shared that the proposal for the requirement of funds for the revised (approved) home stay policy for the items already approved in the Home Stay Policy of the Tourism Department will be submitted for the targets of 2022-23. The other items approved under the policy like renewable energy equipment and toilets are being incorporated in the CAMPA Action Plan, he added.

Detailed discussions also took place on important developmental projects viz. the Construction of the office of the Chief Forest Conservator, Forest parks and Green parks at Chuchot, Sumur Nubra, and the construction of Forest Department guest houses at Nyoma, Hanle, Tangste, Hunder, and Khalsti. It was informed that the Central Public Works Department (CPWD) has been assigned the work of preparation of Detailed Project Reports.

The meeting also discussed the declaration of the Union Territory of Ladakh as an Air Pollution Control Area; the finalization of recruitment rules of the Ladakh Pollution Control Committee, and the approval and adoption of the logo for the Ladakh Pollution Control Committee.


