

World Pneumonia Day: Health department launches SAANS campaign in Leh

Leh: On the occasion of World Pneumonia Day, Social Awareness and Actions to Neutral-Pneumonia Successfully (SAANS) campaign was launched in the Leh district on November 12.

The campaign was launched by Director Health Services, UT Ladakh, Dr. Motup Dorjey.

A one-day orientation programme on SAANS was also organised by the Health Department, Leh for the medical fraternity attended by the Medical Officers and Block Medical Officers of the district.

Chief Medical Officer, Leh, Dr. Nurzin Angmo; District Immunization Officer, Leh; Dr. Diskit Dolma; District Tuberculosis Officer, Leh, Dr. Iqbal Ahmed; Nodal Officer, SAANS program/ Paediatrician, Dr. Tsering Norphel; State Consultant, RCH and NCD, Dr. Rinchen Angmo were present on the occasion.

Director Health Services, Dr. Motup Dorjey added that the SAANS campaign is launched at an apt time as pneumonia cases are mostly detected in the winter months and stressed that timely referral of pneumonia cases, especially in children, plays an important role in effectively curbing pneumonia and consequent deaths.

He added that after the orientation programme the MOs and BMos

should impart training to Community Health Officers, ASHAs, ANMs, and pharmacists as well to ensure that the SAANS campaign is implemented effectively and the targeted goals are achieved timely.

Informing that the under-five mortality rate of UT Ladakh is better compared to the national average and that there was no death reported due to pneumonia in children in the last year, Dr. Motup urged all the stakeholders to strive harder to further reduce the infant mortality rate in the region.

Highlighting the need to neutralize pneumonia, Chief Medical Officer, Leh, Dr. Norzin Angmo, shared that childhood pneumonia results in 16.2% of deaths in children under five years. She stressed the need for capacity-building workshops/ training, a pro-active action plan, digital and mass media awareness, supervision, and monitoring to successfully implement the SAANS campaign.

Moderating the SAANS orientation programme, Nodal Officer, SAANS campaign, Dr.Tsering Norphel, gave a detailed presentation on Childhood pneumonia, its causes, symptoms, protection, prevent and treatment (PPT) strategy, management, and IEC activities.

Earlier, State Consultant, NDC RCH, Dr. Rinchen Angmo briefed about the aims, objectives, and guidelines of the SAANS campaign.

SAANS Initiative was launched on November 2019 to accelerate action to reduce deaths due to Childhood Pneumonia. SAANS Campaign is rolled out in the States/ UTs every year to accelerate action against Childhood Pneumonia by generating awareness on protecting, preventing, and treatment of Childhood Pneumonia and to enhance early identification and care-seeking behaviour among parents and caregivers. Under SAANS, the government is targeting a reduction in pneumonia-caused deaths by 2025 to less than 3 deaths out of 1000 live births.

Two-day annual monastic festival, 'Thiksey Gustor', celebrated

THIKSEY: Two days annual Thiksay Gustor, a monastic religious festival was held on November 11 and 12 at Thiksay monastery.

The day started with the grand religious ceremony attended by the monks of the monastery and hundreds of devotees. Gustor aims to clear away all the sickness, suffering, bad luck, and obstacles of the past year along with prayers and blessing for the coming years.

Mask dances (Chhams) were performed by the monks of the monastery. The two-day celebration ends with the ritualistic dispersal of the storma or the sacrificial cake by the leader of the Black Hat dancers, which symbolize the destruction of all forms of evil.

CEC, Hill Council, Leh Advocate Tashi Gyalson, Executive Councillor, Ghulam Mehdi, Vice President LBA, Chering Dorje Lakrook, and many other dignitaries were present.

Thiskey Gonpa belongs to the Gelukspa order. The Gonpa was first built at Stakmo by Sherab Zangpo. Later the nephew of Sherab Zangpo, Paldan Sherab, founded the Thiskey Gonpa on a hilltop to the north of Indus River. The Thiskey festival (Thiskey Gustor) is held in October- November. Dukhang Karmo is a huge long assembly hall, which consists of the image of Shakyamuni and Maitreya Buddha statues. Chamkhang at the top near the courtyard contains the three-storey Maitreya Buddha's statue, constructed in recent years. Dukhang at the top consists of thousand-armed Avalokitesvara, Shakyamuni Buddha, and Bodhisattvas, Gonkhang contains the statues of Vajra Bhairava, Mahakala & Dharmakaya, the goddess Paldan Lhamo and Cham-sring.

Hill Council, Leh, passes resolution for constitutional safeguard

Ladakh administration reviews amendment to **LCCIR Rules 2020 for quick 5G rollout**

Leh: A meeting of the 5G working committee was held under the chairmanship of Advisor Umang Narula at the Civil Secretariat, Leh on November 11.

The meeting reviewed and discussed the amendments to the Ladakh Communication Connectivity Infrastructure Rules, 2020 (LCCIR), and Right of Way Policy, Ladakh, a move that will accelerate the upgradation and expansion of telecom networks and speed up the roll-out of 5G services in Ladakh.

In the meeting, it was informed that the LCCIR-20 lays down guidelines for the implementation of over-ground (Mobile Towers, Cells on Wheels, etc.) & underground (Optical Fiber Cable) infrastructure establishment in the Union Territory.

Advisor Narula noted that the amendments would pave the way for the deployment of 5G services in the Union Territory.

Principal Secretary, Information Technology Department, Sanjeev Khirwar gave a comprehensive presentation to the participants on the proposed

amendments to the LCCIR, 2020. He stated that these rules were made to introduce transparency and to ease out the entire process of applying for approval, installation, and maintenance of telecom infrastructure across the Union Territory in a timebound manner to ensure quality telecom service in Ladakh. He shared that no charges would be levied for the mobilization of small cells and telegraph lines using street furniture.

Further, he informed that the LCCIR-20 will also be integrated with the central Gati Shakti Sanchar Portal.

The meeting was also attended by the Principal Secretary, Planning and Revenue Department; Commissioner/Secretary, Rural Development Department; DDG (Rural), Chief Engineer, PWD, Telecom Enforcement & Resource Monitoring Cell, J&K; General Manager BSNL, Ladakh, and officials of the IT Department, Ladakh.

The DigiLab is a solution created by the 17000 ft Foundation specifically for Ladakh, which brings the power of digital technology to improve learning, even in areas that are remote, inaccessible, and truly off-grid. The DigiLab Project assumes neither the presence of uninterrupted electricity, mobile connectivity nor existing infrastructure,

and brings together all required components in an offline, but connected system, delivering customized and personalized content through the local internet to students, while also enabling the teachers and administrators to assess and monitor performance periodically through the last mile connectivity app. The DigiLab has been set up in nearly 200 Govt. schools of Ladakh and aids the teacher's traditional face-to-face delivery through highly visual and interactive content and provides an individualized learning platform for each student.

Meeting on implementation of NGT orders on Waste Management and other environmental issues held

LEH: The 2nd UT Level Apex Committee meeting was held under the Chairmanship of Advisor, Ladakh Umang Narula to oversee the implementation of National Green Tribunal (NGT) orders on Waste Management and other environmental issues in the Union Territory on November 9.

The concerned officials presented the action taken report on the decisions taken during the 1st UT Level Apex Committee meeting.

Member Secretary, Ladakh Pollution Control Board (LPCC), Sajad Hussain Mufti apprised the Advisor of the progress made in compliance with National Green Tribunal (NGT) orders and other environmental matters viz. status of installation of Online Continuous Emission Monitoring System for Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) at Agling and preparation of Environment Management Plan (EMP) for grant of consent to operate; status of 'Silence Zone' under provisions of Noise Pollution (Regulation and Control) Rules, 2000 and as per the provisions of approved Action Plan for controlling Noise Pollution; status of survey and auction of E-waste in public offices as per E-Waste Management Rules, 2016, among others.

It was informed in the meeting that the Urban and Rural Development Department has so far identified 05 villages for Model Compliant Towns/Villages and one more will be identified soon as per O.A No 606/2018. Concerning the procurement of handheld noise level meters in compliance with NGT directions, it was informed that 15 units of Noise Level Meters have been procured by the LPCC. Also, the personnel from Traffic Police, Municipal Committees, and Revenue Department have imparted training regarding the operation and handling of Noise

Taking stock of the progress of work, Advisor Narula directed the concerned officials to ensure the completion of work within the stipulated time frame. Detailed discussions also took place on the disposal of legacy waste so that valuable land can be reclaimed and put to better use.

The situation in children is no different where it continues to be the leading cause of mortality worldwide with India accounting for 20% of those deaths and having a higher burden of childhood pneumonia than any other



The Global Coalition against Child Pneumonia observed the first World Pneumonia Day in 2009. Their aim was to bring the facts of the severity of pneumonia to public knowledge and to join hands to bring global attention to the neglected condition of pneumonia. The Day was observed with the general motto "Healthy Lungs for All", and this has been maintained since the first World Pneumonia Day in 2009.

Spalzes Dolma, UPSC EPFO Enforcement officer

Q: Brief us about yourself.

My father is a retired Senior technician in Prasar Bharti and my mother is a housewife. We are three sisters, the elder one is a KAS officer 2011 batch presently working as a Deputy Secretary in Ladakh Secretariat and my younger sister is pursuing MA in Economics. I have done my schooling at Ladakh Public school and Rosary School Delhi and graduated with B.Tech CSE from IP University, Delhi. From 2014 to 2019, I was preparing for KAS and UPSC civil service examinations and unfortunately couldn't able to clear them. In 2020, UPSC released notification for EPFO Enforcement Officer Exam and finally I cleared the examination.

Q. You have secured AIR 284 Rank in the UPSC EPFO Enforcement officer examination. Tell us about your exam preparation strategy, and daily routine while preparing for UPSC.

The syllabus of this exam is very vast and it overlaps with the GS portion of civil service. In addition, Labour Laws, Industrial Relations, and General Accounting Principles forms are the core of this exam. In total, we have to prepare 11 subjects. So along with making my GS portion stronger I have to invest a lot of time in understanding the 3 core subjects mentioned above. I always believe in self-study, so began with random YouTube channels and searching various websites, I used to prepare notes.

The 4 new labour codes have made the syllabus even vast as we have to prepare both i.e 29 old labour laws which are now amalgamated in these 4 labour codes.

Q. Tell us about your job, and what role it plays.

EPFO, the statutory organization under M/o Labour & Deprivation of the world's largest Social Security Organizations in terms of clientele and the volume of financial transactions undertaken. As EPFO operates 3 schemes namely EPF Scheme 1952, Pension Scheme 1995(EPS), and Insurance scheme 1976(EDLI). Enforcement officers are the ears and eyes of this organization. The Employees' Provident Funds & Miscellaneous Provision Act 1952 now extends to the whole of India (after Article 370 abrogation JK PF Act now merged with the EPFO Act 1952 of the central govt.)

As Enforcement Officer we have to enforce the laws of the EPFO Act 1952 in assigned territory and ensures that none of the act is violated

or left unimplemented. Furthermore, EO will ensure establishments in the territory deposits PF regularly. We have to exercise the powers allocated under this Act like seize and seizure powers, Power to inspect, settlement of insurance claims, and pensions. To work as a Public Relation Officer thereby redressing the grievances and assisting the Recovery Officer in the matter of realization of arrears etc.

Q. What is your message to the students from a rural background, who wants to achieve big in life?

We must have a dream; push every hurdle that is stopping us from realizing it. Believe in yourself, and have faith in your abilities, without humble but reasonable confidence in your power.

Regarding less access to education or facility in rural areas, much can be solved now because of various technological advancements. Bridging the rural-urban digital divide, the fruits of DIGITAL INDIA MISSION seem to be reaping in terms of more access to online education, MooC Platforms, E -Pathshalas,

broadbands, DTH channels, etc. Focus more on outcome learning, and vocational and technical education. Take more advantage of the Skill India mission, STARTUP India mission.

If you have the determination and good guidance along with a focused approach, no one can stop you from achieving your dream.

Q. What are your focus area and plans?

I have always aspired to be an administrator, and this job is providing me an opportunity to serve the less privileged, downtrodden, and weaker sections of society. So my focus is right now to work with dedication and commitment as working for their betterment gives me ultimate happiness.

Regarding plans, I will try to achieve higher aims, and in whatever domain I would be in, I will work selflessly and sincerely.

Q. We have come across a saying that cracking UPSC by Ladakhi students is very difficult. Do you believe in it? What are the changes needed?

Cracking UPSC is considered the toughest exam, but I think it would be an injustice to the shear hardwork if we categorize it, es-

paign mobilizes people to protect children from pneumonia and train personnel and other stakeholders to provide prioritized treatment to control the disease.

Deputy CMO, Dr. Muhammad Abbas talked about the initiatives taken by the health department to tackle pneumonia and other diseases. He said the program aims to decrease the infant mortality rate with the help of health departments including ASHA Workers, Anganwadi workers, etc.

He further talked about the importance of the program in tackling pneumonia adding that childhood pneumonia continues to be the topmost infectious killer among under-five children.

He said on the occasion of World Pneumonia Day, the aim of all health departments should aim to accelerate the action against childhood pneumonia by generating awareness on protection, prevention, and treatment aspects and enhancing early identification and care-seeking behaviors among parents and caregivers.

BMO Dr. Fatima said the SAANS campaign will ensure health system strengthening and community awareness towards childhood pneumonia.

She requested the health department and general public to extend their cooperation to ANMs and ASHAs for the early identification of cases of childhood pneumonia and early management of pneumonia in under-five children.

GDC Nubra and Eliezer Joldan Memorial College Leh on November 11.


The event was organised in continuation with the 1st FDP held at Kargil on October 16.
