The Competition carries the first prize of Rs 1.5 lakh and second and third prizes of Rs 1 lakh and Rs 50,000 respectively.

Film Companion, the Agency which has been selected through the bidding process for curating the Film Festival and management of the event gave a detailed presentation about the preparations and execution plan for the successful conduct of The Himalayan Film Festival 2023.

Status of Agriculture practices in Ladakh

Dr. Tsering Stobdan, Agriculture scientist, DIHAR: Today Ladakh is known as a tourist destination, but the region is primarily an agrarian community with roughly 70 percent of the population directly or indirectly dependent on agriculture. For many centuries the people of Ladakh have led a self-reliant existence mainly based upon subsistence agriculture, pastoralism, and caravan trade. Limited land availability and a growing population have resulted in smaller land holdings and additionally crops like wheat and barley do not generate much income. Along with the increasing job opportunities, there is a significant migration from rural areas. However, it is felt that in the future, agriculture must undergo some changes. The hardworking people are already putting in a lot of effort, but everyone must cultivate crops that can generate better income, preferably cash crops. The goal is to achieve a minimum income of 50,000 at least 1 kanal of land for sustainable growth. I focus on targeting wheat, barley, fruits, egetables in Ladakh for product differentiation and branding. I believe that every product

a n d vegetables in Ladakh for product differentiation and branding. I believe that every product should have its own unique identity, reflecting the distinctiveness of Ladakh compared to other states and even the whole world. If we achieve this, regardless of the crop, we can generate a good income. Currently, I am working towards obtaining an organic certification through the Modi Mission Development Initiative of Ladakh for both Leh and Kargil. Once Ladakh's products have an organic certification, they will stand out from others and can be sold at a higher price.

I am currently conducting research at DIHAR, where the focus is on organic farming and all the work done by the PhD students is centered around organic practices. Another area of focus is GI tagging which will indicate that the products are grown exclusively in Ladakh and have unique qualities due to the region's specific conditions. Apricot has already received GI Tagging and I am targeting other products as well. If we can achieve branding like this, there are great opportunities for the agriculture sector in Ladakh.

In Ladakh, only 4 percent of the area is currently used for cultivation, but there is a lot of scope for expansion. We have ample water resources and plenty of vacant land. In earlier times, technology was not advanced enough to harness water effectively. But now, there have been significant changes, and we have access to better resources and techniques. This allows us to improve farming practices and increase productivity. Looking ahead, if we look at the area between Leh and Kargil, there are around 23,000 hectares of land available for cultivation, which is 3.5 times the current area. We have all the necessary facilities for successful farming, as all we need is water and land, both of which are abundant in Ladakh. If we utilize these resources effectively in the future, the prospects are very promising.

Ladakh's unique environment and off-season crop availability give it a distinct advantage. In August, Ladakh is the only place in the world where apricot fruit is available, and in September, Ladakh is the only place where peaches are found. Additionally, Ladakh's fruits are exceptionally sweet and colorful, which is a great advantage. If we can take these fruits to the commercial stage, it will lead to significant development. While vegetable production is limited due to geographical constraints, off-season organic vegetables are only available in Ladakh. The main challenge for farmers is the lack of market access, but if we can establish market linkages, especially for the youth, it will create a bright future.

Ladakh's unique produce can be valued not just as commodities but for their exceptional quality. If Ladakh can come together as a unified entity and establish a strong brand for organic produce, it will ensure the sustainability and profitability of our agriculture.

We must recognize the potential and value of our agricultural resources and work towards creating a thriving and profitable industry. The contribution of Ladakh to agriculture production at the national level is insignificant. Nonetheless, despite all odds, Ladakh is receiving a lot of attention; High Light intensity, High UV radiation, cool temperature and arid environment make the region ideal for growing high-quality niche crops. Hope Ladakh will soon be the organically certified Union Territory.

Solution

• Fieldwork is important in our region, and everyone must contribute to the land-based economy. However, alongside that, it's also essential for people in Ladakh to conduct their research and stay informed. Collaboration and cooperation among farmers and the community are key to a sustainable future.

- It's important to spread awareness about Ladakh's products so that everyone can learn about Ladakh. Ladakh has great potential for agriculture, but we need to use our resources effectively.
- The government is providing subsidies for greenhouses, and it's essential to make good use of them. Everyone should utilize the subsidies and maximize the growth of crops in Ladakh.

Thinles Dawa, Chief Agriculture Officer, Leh: Earlier, agriculture in Ladakh used to rely on organic farming without chemicals, pesticides, and fertilizers, and the system was very good. But over time, with the introduction of tourism and subsidies for rice and wheat, agriculture started getting neglected and the use of chemicals and pesticides increased. In the 90s, when I started working, the use of chemicals was at its peak. The government also instructed farmers to use chemicals and pesticides in Ladakh, saying it would increase income. But later it was realized that the use of chemicals and pesticides was causing harm to health and the environment. Now, Ladakh is moving towards organic farming again, and by 2025, the goal is to have the entire region certified as organic. The agriculture department is working towards this and around 5000 hectares of land have already gone through the certification process. It's a positive step for Ladakh's agriculture. Also, Greenhouse farming in Ladakh has

evolved significantly over the years. In the early 90s, greenhouses were relatively basic, but now there are various types of advanced greenhouses. Recently, DIHAR (Defence Institute of High Altitude Research) established a greenhouse and provided subsidies to more than 1000 people, enabling them to grow fresh vegetables even during peak winter.

In areas with water scarcity, microorganism systems and the Sprinter system have been implemented to provide water through pipes, allowing farming on approximately 12,000 hectares of barren land. In Kulum village, there was a water shortage and residents had to migrate, but they were later rehabilitated and farming was started again using the Sprinkler irrigation system. This approach can be replicated in other villages in Ladakh as well. Farmers are also provided with machinery, and during the winter season, vegetable sellers are given facilities and subsidies to stock and preserve vegetables. This not only improves the quality of the meals but also supports the farmers. These initiatives have been beneficial for the farming community in Ladakh.

Nowadays, flower cultivation has started in Ladakh, and there are great opportunities for young entrepreneurs interested in the flower business. The flowers grown in Ladakh are not easily available in other parts of India in open conditions, so Ladakh benefits greatly from this. If someone is considering starting agriculture or horticulture in Ladakh, it will bring good income in the future. Additionally, consuming organic produce is beneficial for our health, and Ladakh is a positive place where chemicals and such should be avoided. Everyone needs to support and promote agriculture in Ladakh.

It is of utmost importance to establish a robust market linkage for the farmers in Ladakh, especially during the challenging winter season. Currently, the farmers face difficulties in accessing a favorable market to sell their produce. By establishing a strong market linkage, we can ensure that the farmers have a reliable and profitable avenue to sell their crops, enabling them to thrive economically. Moreover, technology transfer plays a vital role in enhancing agricultural practices and productivity. By introducing modern farming techniques and technologies, we can empower farmers to improve their yields and optimize resource utilization. This, in turn, can lead to sustainable agricultural practices and increased profitability for the farmers. In addition to technology transfer, providing exposure opportunities to the youth and scientists is crucial for progress. By sending them to workshops, seminars, and field visits, we can broaden their knowledge and understanding of innovative farming methods. This exposure can inspire them to implement new technologies and techniques in their farming practices, leading to overall growth and development in the agricultural sector. Immediate implementation of these strategies is essential to ensure timely benefits for the farmers. By facilitating market linkages, technology transfer, and exposure opportunities, we can create a supportive ecosystem that fosters agricultural development in Ladakh. This will not only enhance the livelihoods of the farmers but also contribute to the overall economic growth and sustainability of the region. It is important to recognize the significance of upgrading technology in agriculture. By staying updated with the latest advancements,

International Literacy Day


Since 1967, International Literacy Day (ILD) celebrations have taken place annually around the world to remind the public of the importance of literacy as a matter of dignity and human rights, and to advance the literacy agenda towards a more literate and sustainable society. Despite steady progress made across the world, literacy challenges persist with at least 763 million young people and adults lacking basic literacy skills in 2020. Rapidly changing global context took a new meaning over the past years, hampering the literacy progress and widening inequalities across world regions, countries, and populations. In

low- and middle-income countries, the share of 10-year-old children who could not read and understand a simple text with comprehension has increased from 57 per cent in 2019 to an estimated 70 per cent in 2022.

In this context, this year's International Literacy Day will be celebrated worldwide under the theme, 'Promoting literacy for a world in transition: Building the foundation for sustainable and peaceful societies'.

ILD2023 will be an opportunity to join efforts to accelerate progress towards the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG4) on education and lifelong learning and to reflect on the role of literacy in building more inclusive, peaceful, just, and sustainable



societies.

DID YOU KNOW

- Chandrayaan means 'Moon vehicle' in both Sanskrit and Hindi, and Chandrayaan-1 was the first lunar spacecraft launched from India.
- PM Modi announced the celebration of ISRO Day on August 23. The day will commemorate the soft landing of Chandrayaan 3 on the south pole of the Moon.
- The Chandrayaan-3 lander stands about 2 meters tall and has a mass of just over 1,700 kg (3,747.86 lb), roughly on par with an SUV. It is designed to deploy a smaller, 26-kg lunar rover
- The Chandrayaan-3 mission was launched

on July 14 from India's main space port in the southern state of Andhra Pradesh.

- India's previous attempt to land on the lunar south pole failed in 2019. Chandrayaan-2 successfully deployed an orbiter but its lander and rover were destroyed in a crash.
- Russia's first moon mission in 47 years failed over the weekend when its Luna-25 spacecraft crashed into the moon.
- Chandrayaan-1, India's first mission to moon, was an unmanned spacecraft weighing 1380-Kg along with 11 scientific payloads built in India, UK, USA, Germany, Bulgaria



and Sweden. The mission comprised an orbiter and an impactor. Launched successfully by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) on October 22, 2008, the spacecraft was designed to study the Moon orbiting around it at a height of 100 km from the lunar surface.


